Auditions for Prospective Members

Being a musician in the Cornwall Youth Brass Band brings many benefits. There is the chance to make new friends, to work with the best-known and most talented guest conductors and soloists in the Brass Band World, as well as regularly rehearsing with our local tutors.

We are always happy to welcome new musicians to the band and will be holding auditions for new members in September (by arrangement) for those wishing to join for our next season. We have another exciting season lined up and hope that you will encourage your friends to join you in the band. You know how good it is so why not tell them. There is nothing like personal recommendation, so over to you. New Membership and Charging Arrangements

Extended participation rule: As announced during the Easter Concert, we have changed the rule that you have to leave the band when you become 22. Under the old rules you were able to attend a course provided you were under 22 years old. Under the new “extended participation rule”, you may continue your membership of (but not join) the band and attend courses for a further two years. Your position in the band would be determined by the tutors but you would not be able to occupy a principal seat.

Joining fees and annual subscriptions scrapped: In future, membership of the band will be free of charge and there will be no annual subscriptions. Membership will automatically continue until you become too old to be in the band or, if earlier, you inform us of your decision to leave.

If it is reasonable to believe you have left the band, despite not having informed us of your decision to do so, we will treat your membership as having ended. You may, however, apply to renew your membership provided you are under 22 years old. No audition would be required in these circumstances.

Term fees: Subscriptions and course fees are being replaced by term fees. The Residential Term Fee includes music, four pre-course rehearsals and course participation, including meals and accommodation. The Non-residential Term Fee includes music, four pre-course rehearsals and course participation, including meals but not accommodation. Term fees are payable in advance and are non-refundable. Christmas Term fees are due on 1 September and Easter Term fees on 1 January. You will be notified of the amounts payable in August for the Christmas Term and in December for the Easter Term.

However, the 2018 Christmas Term fees have been set at £160 (residential) and £120 (non-residential). Payment can now be made by bank transfer.

CYBB Rules: These have been revised to reflect these changes and the full text of the rules will be available to view on the CYBB website in the information on joining the band.

New Rehearsal Arrangements

Unfortunately, due to funding constraints, Truro College are reducing the availability of its premises to its community partnerships. For us, this means that we will have to finish rehearsals at 1.30pm. To compensate for the loss of rehearsal time we will, in future, start rehearsals earlier, at 9.30am, and have four pre-course rehearsals per term.

Player Reps

During the first rehearsal in September you will be asked to appoint, by vote, two player representatives. Their role is to act as a link between the musicians and the trustees and to canvas, receive and pass on comments, opinions and suggestions from the musicians, all of which, positive or not, are welcomed by the trustees.



Our thanks go to Grace Denford and Matt Opie who have worked very hard on your behalf this year.

There is no restriction on the age of the representatives but a means of transport is needed as it is important that representatives are prepared, as part of their duties, to attend the regular meetings of the trustees and to contribute to those meetings. Under the Charity Constitution of the CYBB, however, voting on resolutions is not permitted. In relation to the CYBB residential courses they assist in the allocation of rooms, help show musicians to their accommodation and generally assist the trustees and welfare team in ensuring that Health and Safety Regulations, CYBB Rules and School Instructions are followed. They also act as role models for the benefit of the smooth running of the course, assist the welfare team by suggesting and, if necessary, helping to organise social activities during the course.

Naturally a commitment to attending all the rehearsals and courses is essential as well as the ability to attend the trustees meetings at Indian Queens Band Room about four times during the year.
